

Pine Hills Camp COVID-19 Policy 2022

As of 4/29/2022

Please note: This policy is subject to change based on guidelines from our medical director and governing bodies of MDHHS and LARA (Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs). Pine Hills Camp will follow all guidelines as required to maintain our camp license.

Before Camp

- Campers are encouraged to be prudent in the 14 days leading up to camp to avoid an unnecessary exposure.
- Campers should monitor any possible Covid symptoms for the 14 days leading up to camp.
 - Any campers with signs or symptoms related to COVID should be assessed by a health care professional or obtain a negative COVID test. A PCR test is strongly advised if any serious symptoms (loss of smell/taste, fever, unexplained cough) arise.
 - Parents are encouraged to inform the camp nurse if their child has a confirmed case of COVID in the 90 days leading up to camp. This will help camp staff assess who may be at risk of exposure if there is a suspected case during camp.
- Any camper who tests positive within 10 days of camp must notify camp staff.
 - Consultation with camp medical staff will take place to discuss the possibility of a late arrival to camp based on timing of isolation.
- Any camper exposed to someone positive for COVID within 10 days of the first day of camp should notify the camp medical staff and directors. We will follow current MDHHS guidelines regarding quarantine.

At Camp

- Campers will be asked at check-in if they have any signs or symptoms related to COVID; if so, the camper will need to present proof of a negative test (not from an over the counter/home test) prior to joining camp.
- Temperatures will be taken at camp check-in, per YMCA guidelines.
- Daily announcements will be made to remind campers to inform their counselors if any symptoms arise during camp week.
- Any symptoms of COVID or other illness will be evaluated by the camp medical staff.
 - If there is concern for COVID, the camper will be isolated immediately, parents will be notified, and the camper must go home until proof of a negative test is obtained (not from an over the counter/home test) and symptoms have resolved for 24 hours.
 - Close contacts will be monitored but will not be required to go home or be quarantined unless there is a confirmed positive case.
 - If there is a confirmed positive test, all close contacts will be closely monitored and their parents will be notified. If a close contact develops symptoms, we will follow current guidelines from MDHHS/LARA to determine whether that camper must go home.
- Campers are expected to follow adequate hand hygiene throughout camp; hand washing stations and/or hand sanitizer will be available in each building.
- CAMPERS WILL NOT BE REQUIRED TO WEAR MASKS AT CAMP.
